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Travelling to Ajloun

It is time to arrange your travels!

- Dates: It is important to arrive in Ajloun in time for the first dinner, so please plan your arrival for 8th September at 17:00 at the latest (05:00 pm). Of course, it will always be possible to arrive later if there is no other choice.
- Please, fill in this <u>FORM</u> about your arrival and departure times, in order to arrange the transportation and the reimbursement procedure.
- The visa cost is 40 JOD (60 Euros) for the following countries (Spain, Italy, France, Belgium, and Morroco) and must be paid upon arrival at the airport/land port. (accept credit / debit cards are accepted)
- You're going to spend some more time in Jordan? Travels can only be reimbursed, if your stay before and after the training lasts a maximum of 2 days before and after, e.g. you could arrive on 6th September and leave on 19th September.
 - If you want to arrive in Jordan on 6th September or before or leave on 19th September or later, we **cannot** unfortunately reimburse your journey according to the rules of our Funding.
 - Please note that accommodation before 8th September, and after 17th September will not be covered by the project.
- Visitors to Jordan are required to fill in a declaration form below and obtain the free QR code that shall be presented upon boarding https://www.visitjordan.gov.jo/form/ (The address in Jordan is: Ajloun, Anjara, Serapis 26861, The hostel: Aliwa Abu Sajin Castle)

Upon arrival

Upon arriving at the airport, you will go through security controls and get to the arrival hall. There is free WiFi.

1. Outside the airport ask where to buy the bus tickets, buses depart every 30 minutes from

- 6:30 am to 6:00 pm, and every 60 minutes from 6:00 pm to 00:00 am. **Must read about the bus** https://www.amman-airport.com/bus.php
- 2. Purchase a ticket and board the bus until the last stop, where you'll find an SSD volunteer. Who will take you to the venue
- 3. Our team will pick you up from the airport if you arrive after the last bus leaves (00:00 a.m.).

About the training

Bio-construction means respect for nature, health, and well-being, sustainability, local materials (raw, no energy wasted in production and transport), self-sufficiency, harmony with the environment, low environmental impact, and appropriate and targeted techniques.

In all of its phases, the construction of buildings has an impact on the environment: extraction of raw materials, transportation, handling, commissioning, operation, end of life, and waste disposal. Building materials are produced by considering many factors, such as the extraction of raw materials, the use of non-renewable resources, and the use of energy to convert them into products.

Bio-construction is NOT about building green roofs or using clay as plaster. It is about sustainability and reducing the mass production of industrial construction materials, and using earth materials instead. We believe that bio-construction is a way to advocate and promote a sustainable lifestyle and limit the harm to the Earth.

This Call for Participants regards the third training in the general project, the bio-construction that will take place in Ajloun, Jordan from 08-17 September 2022. The training will bring together 14 participants from 8 different countries who will be introduced to the basic concepts of bio-construction and natural building to get inspired and continue learning in this field. The participants will practise some building techniques with soil and straw bales during the training. The training is an opportunity for participants to connect, exchange ideas, and identify channels to advocate sustainable construction.

<u>English</u> will be the working language of the training. The facilitators will use simple English so that all can understand. In order to feel part of the group, it will be important that everybody makes an effort to speak in English so that nobody feels excluded.

We want this training to be a safe space for all participants.

How to prepare yourself?

Besides your basic and personal items, including clothes for the season appropriate and the place, you should also bring:

- make sure to bring your towel
- passport
- laptop
- summer clothing and warm clothes for evenings
- work clothes you don't mind ruining,
- working gloves and hat
- toiletries (biodegradable) and a towel
- some cash (official currency is JOD, exchange offices are available in Ajluon, and in the airport)
- anything else you need for your free time (books, instruments, games...)
- food items from the home to share with others during coffee breaks

The Venue



- The training will take place in an <u>ecological housing complex</u> in Ajloun. With simple living conditions. The participants will be hosted in shared rooms. You will share the room with some other participants. We will have separate rooms for males and females. Participants are expected to take initiative regarding cleaning their accommodation and participation in certain tasks during the training days for the smooth running of the training.
- The food is vegan and vegetarian, with mainly local and seasonal products.

Reimbursement Procedure

For this project, you need to buy your travel tickets yourself and we will transfer the money to you after the project.

Here are the steps for a successful reimbursement of your travel costs:

- 1. Please **keep all your tickets** (trains, subway, bus, plane, Blablacar), **invoices, receipts, AND boarding passes** (plane) carefully.
- 2. Right after you are back home, send all tickets, together with the reimbursement form that you will receive by mail, or e-mail to the sending organization.
- 3. Reimbursements will be done after the end of the training via bank transfer. We strongly suggest that you **keep the original tickets and save the scanned files** on your computers, please don't throw the original physical tickets away.

The marvels of nature and the genius of mediaeval Arab military architecture have given northern Jordan two of the most important ecological and historical attractions in the Middle East: the sprawling pine forests of the Ajloun-Dibbine area, and the towering Ayyubid castle at Ajloun, which helped to defeat the Crusaders eight centuries ago.
